



Greetings,

The Products and Services Committee just published the 2013 FS-ISAC Road Map for the Secure Portal. (Tracking ID# 90900) The enhancements will take place over six phases.

Phase I occurred in January 2013 when FS-ISAC converted over to the new portal. Phase II will offer Alert Profiling with a new Alert Profiles tab on the home page, and XML Email Alerting for Premier and above members. User acceptance testing is slated for May 24, 2013.

Phase III will feature RSA Token Management and is to be completed around the June time frame. Phase IV will provide some enhancements for internal administrators and will also have the Member Directory, which will be used by members to look up specialist POCs at member organizations and for member POCs to manage contact information. This should happen around the September time frame.

Phase V will integrate the NC4 Risk Center, XML feeds and alerting and Secunia alerts. This phase will be completed around the November time frame.

Finally, Phase VI, scheduled for the first quarter of 2014, will allow for adaptive authentication.
