As mentioned in previous newsletters, the public/private partnership has gotten a lot of play this year with the issuance of the new Executive Order, Presidential Policy Directive 21 (PPD-21), testimony in front of Congress and meetings with the President.

The FSSCC and the FS-ISAC have been coordinating closely in participating and responding to DHS around the eight working groups set up to address the actions outlined by the EO and PPD-21.

Currently several members are active in the NIST framework working group and the new NIST Cybersecurity Framework has been released. It can be accessed at <http://www.nist.gov/itl/cyberframework.cfm>.

Another active working group is the Evaluation and Planning Working Group NIPP Update Effort. The National Infrastructure Protection Plan (NIPP) is the guiding document for the public private partnership framework.
